## Summary of the Deployment of the MEAG Grant 2022-2023

### MEAG Grant

*The aim of the MEAG is to raise the achievement of eligible children and young people from minority ethnic backgrounds in Wales. The grant reimburses local authorities for expenditure on educational services in support of children and young people from minority ethnic backgrounds the majority of whom are learning English, or Welsh, as an additional language. The grant also reimburses local authorities for expenditure on educational services to improve standards of achievement for children from minority ethnic backgrounds who are underachieving, or at risk of underachieving. The grant is available for pupils from age 3 to 18; all 22 local authorities benefit from the grant and use it to fund Ethnic Minority Achievement Grant.*
